WHERE TO DINE

To the south of the city's central district, Contraste Ristorante is a Milanese restaurant where food and personalised service meet. Designed to mimic ancient osterias, the food offered is based around the chef's discussions with the guests. Their design theory also revolves around creating a private getaway space for guests, with a simple white table cloth on a table surrounded by simple decor. The creators of this experience each focus on one aspect of their food philosophy, those being the past, the present and the future, and how these can

be used to create a contrasting experience that will not be forgotten in a hurry.

As one of Enrico Bartolini's projects, Ristorante Mudec Milano has earned three Michelin stars and delivers on its incredible reputation with every bite. The restaurant is located inside the Museum of Cultures in the centre of the design district and focuses on experimentation and the future of Italian cuisine. With an intimate and cosy atmosphere, Ristorante Mudec is the perfect location for a quiet dinner that boasts incredible food at the heart of Il Luogo di Aimo e Nadia is all



about combining Italian cuisine with contemporary taste. WHAT TO DO

The Duomo di Milano is a beautiful historical cathedral in the centre of Milan. The gorgeous statues covering the outside of the building and the rooftop views of the city are worth a trip to the



iconic building, and the tour of the inside of the 14th century cathedral boasts incredible stained-glass windows. The connected museum displays elements that were all a part of the cathedral at some point in its history and adorned its spires, towers and walls. This cathedral is such an integral part of Milan's history and is one of the most famous monuments in the city.

From operas to symphonies and ballet, the Teatro alla Scala is an institution in Milan

as a cultural experience with something for everyone. The crimson and gold interior that lines the museum as well as the seating shows the 18th Century design and makes it clear why this opera house is celebrated as a monument throughout Europe.

Football is one of the great Italian pastimes, and Milan is a leading force behind this cultural institution. San Siro Stadium is the home of both of Milan's biggest teams, AC Milan and Inter. Sports fans will love the atmosphere at San Siro, with crowds of up to 80,000 fervent fans beating the drum. As the 'temple of football', the stadium also offers a tour and has a museum to showcase the amazing history of the city's most prominent sports venue.
