The Queen's Gambit star Anya Taylor-Joy was adorned with a Tiffany & Co. platinum and 18k gold necklace bearing a marquise diamond of more than eight carats from the jeweller's 2023 Blue Book collection, matched with diamond and platinum earrings and glittering white diamond rings.

Jamie Lee Curtis took to Instagram to say "I am wearing a gold cuff with a diamond encrusted replica of the Winged Victory of Samothrace. The statue was worshipped in a temple built for her. Cathy Waterman first saw her at the top of the stairs at the Louvre when she was a teenager, and it did something remarkable for her in that moment. It showed her that there was a huge unknown world out there, and led her to a study of ancient history. What an inspiration she's been to Cathy and it's my great honour to wear her to the Oscars on my wrist!"

Eva Longoria wore Swiss jeweller Bucherer and Michelle Yeoh added extra sparkle to her sequined Oscar night ensemble with a pair of diamond leaf high jewellery earrings by celebrity jeweller, Cindy Chao.



For the men, nature-inspired brooches were in full swing, with Matthew McConaughey in a yellow diamond ribbon brooch by Cindy Chao, *Past Lives* star and Teo Yoo, in an 18k white gold Cartier tortoise brooch with emeralds and diamonds to match a pair of Trinity de Cartier rings and Pasha de Cartier watch.

New *Doctor Who* Ncuti Gatwa wore a Tiffany Four Leaves brooch, crafted with 18-carat gold and platinum, with a significant blue tanzanite weighing over 41 carats and Simu Liu went for a De Beers diamond brooch, paired with his limited-edition, \$57,000 Jacob & Co. timepiece.

Robert Downey Jr arrived in an Elsa Peretti for Tiffany & Co Amapola floral brooch in 18k yellow gold, pavé diamonds and black silk – and went home with Best Supporting Actor for his role in *Oppenheimer*.

Barbie star Ryan Gosling shimmered in a pink crystal-embellished suit for his show performance of *I'm Just Ken* – alongside Guns 'n Roses rocker

Slash – which he backed up with a TAG Heuer Carrera Date Plasma Diamant d'Avant-Garde in pink. Only the best for the TAG Heuer Ambassador – the watch featured TAG Heuer's own lab-grown diamonds. Although it was Billie Eilish's ballad *What Was I Made For?* that took the only Academy Award for the film, winning Best Original Song.

Stand by for the 97th Oscars this year, scheduled to take place on Sunday, March 2, with the star-studded ceremony kicking off at 4pm (GMT -7) for those ready to be glued to the red carpet. Jewel in the crown

2024's 96th Annual Academy Awards produced a dazzling array of jewellery on the red carpet, including Emily Blunt, Emma Stone, Zendaya and Ariana Grande wearing Tiffany, Bulgari and Cartier

Last March's Oscars hit all the right notes 95 years after the first Academy Awards ceremony, with Christopher Nolan's biopic *Oppenheimer* stealing the show at the official ceremony. Tiffany, Bulgari, Louis Vuitton and Cartier were among the winners on the red carpet, where a new double-collar necklace trend was out in force, with Best Supporting Actress nominee Emily Blunt, her *Oppenheimer* co-star Florence Pugh and Charlize Theron all sporting the look. Elsewhere, pendant earrings with

phenomenal gemstones were hot on the trail and there was a certain pink flavour in the air, with *Barbie* up for eight nominations. A radiant Emma Stone wore white gold, sapphire and diamond high jewellery necklace and ring from Louis Vuitton to accept her award for Best Actress performance in *Poor Things*. Blunt doubled up with a pair of Tiffany & Co. necklaces, combining a triple-stranded platinum and diamond jewellery piece – set with more than 60 carats of cushion-cut diamonds – with a platinum and diamond

choker. Nominated for her role as Robert Oppenheimer's wife Kitty and former Community Party USA member, Blunt's pair of platinum and diamond stud earrings and a beautiful platinum ring featuring 10-carat, pear shaped diamond played the perfect support role on the carpet.

Presenting the award for Best Actress, 2014 winner Charlize Theron layered on two diamond necklaces by Parisian jeweller

Boucheron, complete with white gold and diamond rings, diamond bracelets and long diamond 'Quatre Radiant' earrings. Ariana Grande wore a Tiffany & Co pendant necklace featuring a baby-pink morganite weighing over 14 carats and a pair of drop-shaped morganite and diamond earrings, and *Barbie* Director Greta Gerwig paired her diamond Boucheron collier necklace with the Maison's emerald-cut morganite 'Vendôme Liseré' ring, for a subtle touch of pink.
