### BANGKOK

Aman Nai Lert nests within the seven-acre green oasis of Nai Lert Park in Thailand's capital, Bangkok. Perfectly placed for an immersion into the city, the Jean-Michel Gathy-designed hotel is home to 52 suites, a 1,500-square-metre Aman Spa & Wellness centre and several luxury dining venues.

Reflecting Thailand's healing lore, as well as the capital's status as a leading global hub for wellness optimisation, Aman Spa & Wellness spans three floors, offering 1,500 square metres of space dedicated to wellbeing. With Medical Wellness by Hertitude Clinic on the eighth floor, and a holistic Aman Spa

wellness programmes unfold across several modalities, tailored to individual needs and enhanced by the hotel's naturally restorative surrounds. From a Royal Thai massage using heated rice compresses to its traditional wood-clad Banya sauna and venik (oak or birch leaves clustered together) to massage, stimulate and exfoliate the skin. aman.com/hotels/

#### **GERMANY**

The flagship hotel in the prestigious Oetker Collection, Brenners Park-Hotel & Spa, is set to captivate the hearts of travellers once again as one of Germany's most historic hotel reopens its doors in the heart of the historic spa town of Baden-Baden, following an extensive 18-month renovation project. For more than 150 years, Brenners has been a true icon of European grand hospitality and its relaunch marks a new

era for the iconic hotel, with a harmonious and exciting fusion of past, present, and future, complementing the hotel's luxry spa and medical services.

Originally opened in 1872, the new chapter preserves the hotel's rich heritage and Beaux-Arts architectural style, while bringing in new restaurants, Fritz & Felix restaurant and Restaurant Wintergarden, as well as the renovation of Villa Stéphanie in 2015. Historical elements, such as the traditional staircases, original doors, and distinctive window frames, have been beautifully preserved and for the first time in the hotel's history, the original 19th century hidden brickwork on the east side of the main building has been uncovered, offering a rare glimpse into the architectural roots of the storied landmark. 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**KYOTO** 

Four-storeys high and home to 92 rooms and suites, Capella Kyoto pays homage to the city's rich heritage through its curation of Japanese artworks and artefacts. Minutes away from the celebrated Miyagawa-chō Kaburenjo, a theatre for geiko and maiko dances, each guest room is furnished with intricate textures in a contemporary manner to embrace the future, while respecting the important legacy of Kyoto's geisha traditions.

## HAMILTON ISLAND, AUSTRALIA

Hamilton Island's new boutique hotel is in the heart of Australia's World Heritage Listed Great Barrier Reef. Situated at the northern end of palm-fringed Catseye Beach, The Sundays

offers 59 rooms with a choice of either a balcony or terrace, overlooking the Coral Sea and the hotel's gardens.

The hotel features private cabanas around a pool exclusively for guests and a waters-edge restaurant and bar offering al fresco dining with views of the aquatic playground that is Catseye Bay.

Set to open in Autumn 2025 (AEST), it is expected to significantly contribute to the Whitsundays' visitor economy, providing employment for over 100 full-time equivalent hospitality workers in the region.
