**FOUR SEASONS RESORT MALDIVES AT GIRAAVARU**

Situated in the North Malé Atoll, the resort is reachable by speedboat transfer from Malé International Airport, avoiding the need for a domestic flight. Its unusually large island provides long beaches and ample space between villas, allowing guests

a greater sense of privacy and an unusual sense of scale for the Maldives. The spacious villas feature generous indoor and outdoor areas, many with private pools and direct access to the beach or lagoon. The resort offers a calm atmosphere, personalised service, and dedicated family areas, giving the island broad appeal without compromise.

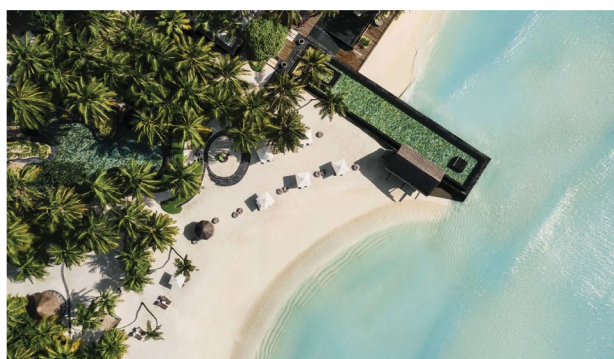
